Our Grand Finale was held on the 11<sup>th</sup> November 2010 to Co-incide with 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of our Stalwart of the Movement, "MISS SILVERENE SWER" who completed 100 years on the 12<sup>th</sup> November, 2010. I don't think there is any other state who is so lucky like ours to have a Stalwart of 100 years along with the age of Girl Guiding and that she is very strong in mind, body and spirit. She dedicated the secret of her healthy and long life to Girl Guiding. The Ex-Chief Minister, who is the State Adviser, Shri D. D. Lapang, was the Chief Guest, and Shri. P.J. Bazeley, IAS, the Guest of Honour. A good number of all other old scouts and guides like Mrs. E.N. Shullai, Mrs. Queenie Rynjah, Shri L. K. Sailo, Shri W.D. Jyrwa and many others, participated the activity. Miss Silverene Swer, the 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday Girl was the main attraction. Every one was amazed at her active senses at that age. She spoke so well about her guiding days remembered each occasions and sang together the guides' songs. The birth day cake was contributed by the I.S.G.F. members, was inaugurated by her and distributed to about 2000 (two thousand) participants on that day at the Grand Centenary Tea Party. A Special Souvenir Magazine with her photographs of her as provincial Commissioner of Guides in 1940 taken at Lucknow during the Commissioners Conference. She joined the Movement in 1928 as a Ranger from Scottish College, Calcutta continued as Guider, trained as a Trainer/Adviser and worked in many states of North East. She is the Pioneer of Girl – Guiding in many North Eastern States. In Mizoram she started the 1st Guiding Unit, in Arunachal Pradesh, she was responsible for building the education department and Scouting / Guiding, in Assam she was the Trainer covering till West Bengal. She received her Silver Elephant National Award in 1990 at the Rashtrapati Bhavan. She is a Padmashri of 1992. She is a woman of substance, "Once a Guide, always a Guide".
